ARTIST'S NOTE

“Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name” These are some of my most favored words in the entire Episcopal liturgy. It is said “Wherever two or three are gathered, [God] is in the midst of them” but when we sing, the whole holy church is in the midst of us, singing together. It is as if all the saints in heaven are standing here with us, joined hand in hand breathing as one. The latin word for breathing, “spirare” has given us several common words in the English language: Aspire, to “breathe on” heavily with the exertion of aspiring to a goal; Conspire, to “breathe together” in harmony or in unity, Expire, to “breathe out” at our last breath; and interestingly, Spirit, the one who breathes through us. It is in breathing that we find one of God’s names, Yahweh, or as written YHWH, the sound we make as we inhale and exhale. One of my mentors once told me a quote that I hold onto to this day, “The greatest thing you can do in life is to simply breathe and listen.” When we breathe and listen, we find God, the spirit, and our connection with all the saints in heaven. Take time today to simply breathe and listen to the community of saints around us, celestial, earthly, and in you.

ABOUT THIS WEEK'S MUSICIAN

Born and raised in New York City, cellist Nat Chaitkin attended the University of Michigan, and performed at the White House for 8 years as a member of the U.S. Marine Chamber Orchestra. He currently teaches at CCM Prep and reaches new audiences for classical music with his solo program, Bach and Boombox. Nat is also the cellist in the 4-Way Quartet.

Founded in 2015, 4-Way Quartet has become one of the Cincinnati area’s leading chamber groups, making multiple, sold-out appearances at both the Taft Museum and Montgomery’s “Live at the UNI” series. 4-Way also regularly performs in chamber music’s original setting, private homes, to raise funds for the group’s innovative education program, the 4-Way String Project. Now in its eighth year, this program offers free private lessons and chamber music instruction to economically challenged students in Norwood.

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and

made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with the ever Blessed Virgin Mary and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**
