As we come back together after the summer months – journeys here and there, new adventures, new places, new friends, and new faces – we are called back on this “Back to Church” Sunday to embrace one another in the joy of the Spirit.

The art seen above comes from a community mural in Philadelphia in collaboration with the Mural Arts Philadelphia. Depicted is a joyous community brought together with music. Today we celebrate several things: the “Back to Church Sunday” where we all gather again, the return of our All Saints Choir, the welcoming of new choral scholars, and the installation of our new Director of Music Ministry. All of which are reasons to rejoice! One of the many binding fabrics of society and us as a community at All Saints is a love and passion for music. Music speaks directly to the soul and speaks in emotion. Today, we hope to lift our voices in joy and love.

The music selected for today’s service surrounds these themes carried throughout the readings and sermon: Gathering as one in joy and love to carry forth the light of Christ. From the hymns come the images of what it means to truly walk as a child of the light

of Christ, for “When we have run with patience the race, we shall know the joy of Jesus.” A favored line in the communion hymn speaks to the essence of the message today, “The love that made us makes us one, and strangers now are friends.” The love that created you and I has knit us so deeply together, in spite of our differences so that we may gather as one.

“Gathered in God’s Name” by Michael Burkhardt provides a wonderful message of gathering in love. THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

THE FIRST LESSON

Exodus 12:1-14

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbor in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. Your lamb shall be without blemish, a year-old male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month; then the whole assembled congregation of Israel shall slaughter it at twilight. They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. They shall eat the lamb that same night; they shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over the fire, with its head, legs, and inner organs. You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the Lord. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the Lord. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the Lord; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

THE SECOND LESSON

Romans 13:8-14

Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, “You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet”; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, “Love your neighbor as yourself.” Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.
